The Year 6 teaching team look forward to our final term together. May it be filled with learning, laughter, love and sunshine.

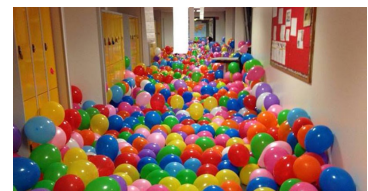
