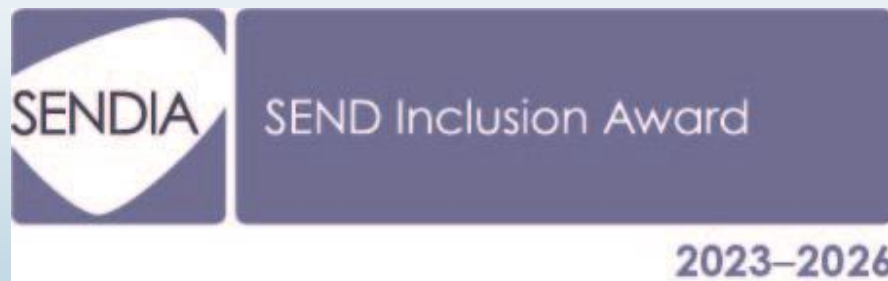

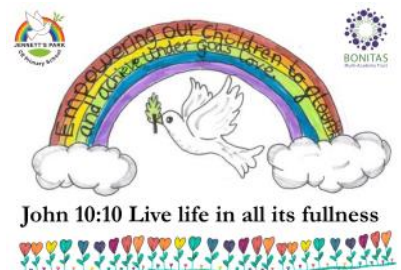

Well done boys and thank you to Mr Page, Mrs Andrews and all the amazing parents who helped drive children and cheer the teams on!



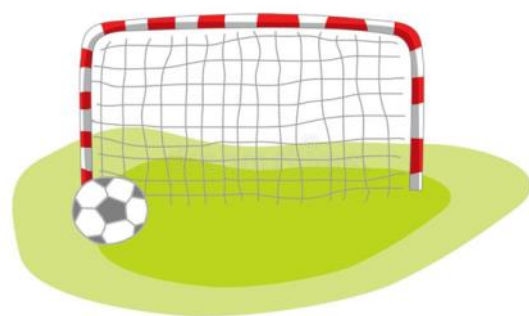
Football League

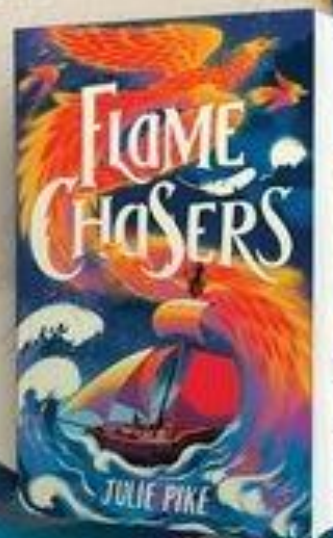
