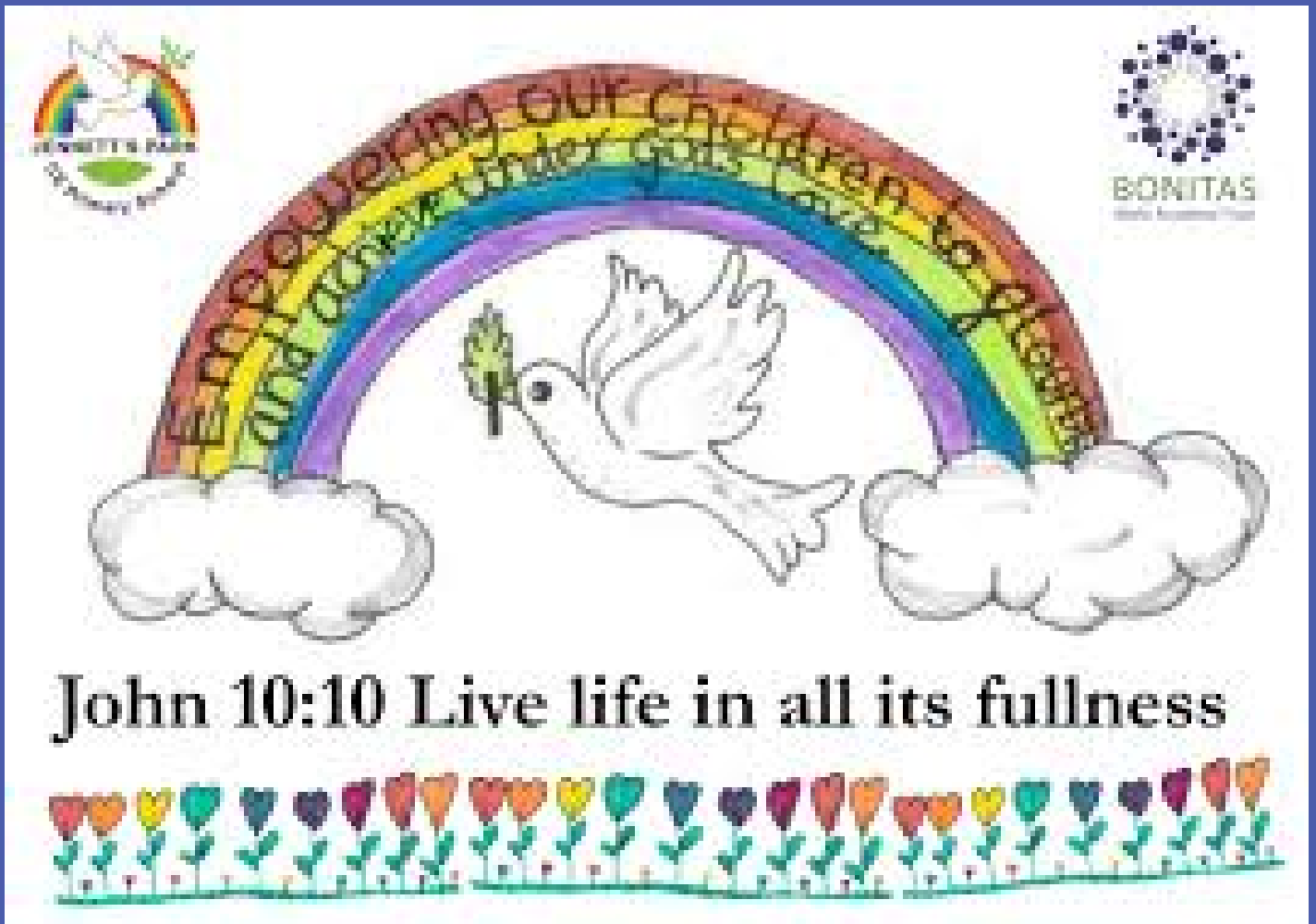

# HAF vouchers

The holiday activities and food (HAF) programme is funded by the Department for Education. It is designed to support children eligible for benefits related free school meals.

The sessions are focused on enrichment activities, such as sports, craft and drama and include a nutritious meal.

HAF runs during parts of the school holidays at:

Easter - 4 sessions

summer - 16 sessions

Christmas - 4 sessions

Sessions vary in length and are down to the individual clubs and the activities they are providing.

HAF does not run during half terms.

Booking sessions

How the booking system works

The eequ booking system has information on children entitled to benefit related free school meals.

When a parent registers their details on eequ, it will automatically match with their child's details and allow them to book sessions.
