Reminders

Coats: Please remember to bring a coat for your child. Coats should be warm and have hoods so children's outdoor play is not interrupted by cold or rain.

Welly Boots: You may like to keep a named pair of wellies at Nursery, or send welly boots on wet days.
We do have spare wellies that can be borrowed.

Water Bottles: Your child can help themselves to drinking water throughout the session so please remember to supply a named water bottle.

Snack: You do not need to provide snack. We offer snack each day so children can choose from a selection of fruit and vegetables if they are hungry. They are also offered a carton of cow's milk, if they would like it.

Naming Belongings: Please remember to name everything, especially jumpers/cardigans, coats, hats, gloves and shoes. Items can be easily misplaced when they are taken off, but we are usually able to reunite them with the correct owner if they are named.



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What can I do at home?

Developing Fine Motor Skills at home

- ⇒ Peeling fruit such as bananas and satsumas.
- ⇒ Sprinkling sprinkles onto iced biscuits or cakes.
- ⇒ Filling ice cube tray by spooning or pouring water.
- ⇒ Washing the dishes and wringing out the sponge.
 - ⇒ Helping to peg out the washing.
 - ⇒ Sorting socks and pegging together in pairs.
 - ⇒ Watering the plants using a spray bottle.

Developing Gross Motor Skills at home

- ⇒ Mixing ingredients together with a large spoon in a large bowl.
 - ⇒ Wiping down a table or counter top.
 - \Rightarrow Sweeping the floor with a broom.
 - \Rightarrow Helping to fold larger items such as towels or sheets.
- ⇒ Using a rake to tidy leaves or grass cuttings outside.
 - ⇒ Pulling up weeds in the garden.
- \Rightarrow Using a large sponge to wash the windows or car.

Tips to support your child at home

Reading—Daily reading with your child helps to build imagination and vocabulary. This can be done before bed time or at any point in the day. Predicting what may come next in a story will help to deepen their understanding.

Self-help skills—Encouraging your child to become more independent when managing their clothes. Can your child put on their own coat? Can they put on their own gloves, hat and scarf? If they can do this then can they put on their own socks and shoes?

Nursery rhymes—Singing Nursery rhymes together can help build a range of skills. They can help your child to recognise different sounds in words, rhyme, counting and building motor skills with actions.
