Curriculum

Our Topic, the whole of the Spring term, is the Vikings. Please look at the overview on the website for details of exactly what is being taught.

Our RE sessions will be focussing on the creation story through the eyes of Christians and Jews.

In Science, we begin exploring forces and magnets and investigating how magnets interact with each other.

We are also looking at health and safety in PSHE and learning about transport in our Spanish lessons.

5 top tips to support your child this half term

- 1. Reading—Frequently and short sharp bursts. four times a week at least and for 10— 15 minutes. They do not need to finish the book every time. Just make a note in their reading record to show where they go to and pick up from where they left off. We will only change books that have been read at home so please do write in the record book.
- 2. Questioning—Both in reading and in general day to day occurrences to build on their reasoning and inference. E.g. How do you think that made the character feel? Why are there leaves on the ground? Which way looks best?
- 3. Writing opportunities— list writing; shopping lists, jobs to do, Birthday list, holiday plans etc. Cards, Thank you cards, letters and weather diary. All of these will support writing development.
- 4. Timetable practice— In Year 3 we are recapping our 2, 5, 10 times tables, then we will be learning our 3, 4 and 8 times tables. This is expected to be done weekly alongside home learning. If you have misplaced your username and password for Times Table Rockstars (TT Rockstars) please let us know.
- 5. Number fluency—quick number recognition by looking for patterns and bonds 10-100 E.g. I know that 6 and 4 is 10 so 6 and 14 is 20 and 6 and 24 is 30 etc. The children have been using playing cards to help with this.
