## Curriculum

We are continuing our Viking learning this half term and are eagerly looking forward to our Ufton Court visit. Through our Vikings topic we will look at the continents of the world, how Vikings raided and where they settled. In PE we are thinking about using communication to help us in our physical skills to help game play and getting good control over the ball in different activities, with focus on tag rugby. In RE this term we are focussing on the story of Easter from Christianity and why Christians celebrate every year. Our Science topic for this half term is looking at living things and the body.

## Number facts.

Taking time to practice number facts such as number bonds and times tables will support your child as they move through KS2.

## Writing practice

Ask your child to help write the shopping list, cards, match reports, film or book reviews. This will support the development of handwriting and spelling skills.
