# What happens when I come to school?

Your grown-up will bring you to the reception gate, where your teacher will be waiting for you.

You will hang up your coat on your own special peg in the cloakroom, like the children are doing.

**"Hello. My name is Aria,"** says Aria.

**"Hello. I'm Omari,"** says Omari.

Your teacher will check who is in school and then you will have a chat about things like the weather, what day of the week it is, or any news you have. Your teacher will tell you about the exciting things you are going to do that day.

# What will I do in school?

You will have lots of exciting activities to do in your classroom and outside. Sometimes you will play with your teacher, and class and sometimes you can choose what you do.

All of the activities are lots of fun and you will learn as you play. You will soon get to know the other children in your class, and make friends.

# What happens when I need to go to the toilet?

You will go to the toilet by yourself. You can go whenever you need to. Just remember to tell your teacher that you are going.

Aria will then use either the hand drier or a paper towel before she goes back to play with Lily.

If you have an accident or need help, tell your teacher and they will help. Your grown-ups will leave some spare clothes in school in case you need them.

The children are telling their grown-ups all about their day at school.

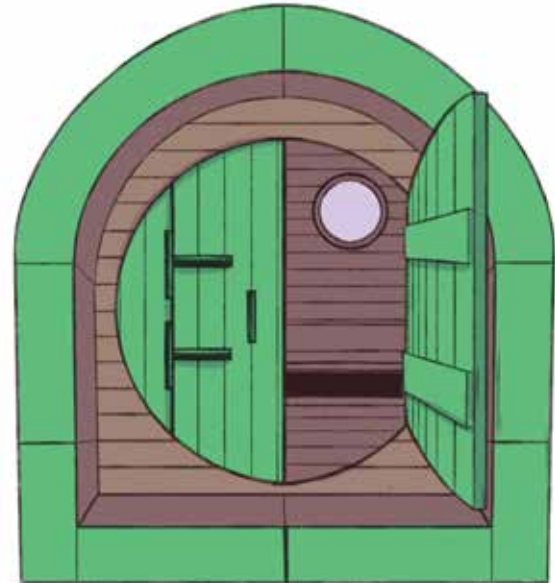
**"I hope you enjoy looking at your book,"** says the teacher.
