

# **SQUID/PARENTPAY UPDATE**

As of Monday, we will be processing all school lunches and trips via ParentPay. There may be a delay in parents/carers being able to see what lunches have been ordered next week. Please bear with us as this is a manual set up on Monday morning, equally we will be patient while parents try to pay familiarise themselves with how to pay for school lunches. All children will be fed, even if the charges appear later!

The first contact for each child should have now received a ParentPay log in. The next parent/carer contact for children are being added so please look out for an email from ParentPay. If neither parent has yet received an email from ParentPay, please email <u>secretary@jennetts.bonitas.org.uk</u>

As previously advised, any dinner debt must be paid today on sQuid otherwise this debt will be passed onto school.

**ReachMoreParents**: this is the parent app where you can: report absences, complete forms, receive communications and pay for trips and lunches. We would recommend installing this app on your Apple or Android phone if you are able to.

**ParentPay**: this is the payment provider used by ReachMoreParents, we will use this for paying for trips and lunches. Unfortunately, we have to set up a separate log in for this to use until the connection is updated by ReachMoreParents, they are working on this now.

### Accessing ParentPay through ReachMoreParents app

Soon, parents/carers will be able to access ParentPay within the ReachMoreParents app, without the need to keep entering passwords. This is in the process of being rolled out on the app, as sadly ReachMoreParents found out about sQuid closing at the same time as schools so are working hard to get the single sign in working!

Hopefully very soon, parents will be able to log into ReachMoreParents and carry out all your trip payments/lunches in a very straightforward way.

#### How to access ParentPay

Parents can download the ReachMoreParents app and log in. Parents will see a 'ParentPay' option. Clicking this will take you to the login screen where you will need to enter your details. Everything should be easily accessed from ReachMoreParents soon, although please bear with us as they create these connections. In the meantime, you can also log into ParentPay's website separate from ReachMoreParents as well.

### What can I do on ParentPay?

Parents are able to contribute to school trips and workshops on ParentPay. If you have a child in Year 3-6 you need to pay for their school lunches using ParentPay.

- Y5/Y6 parents and carers will see some trips are now payable if you had outstanding trip or swimming balances

- Y1/2/3 will see the recent Lego STEM workshop are now payable

# The impact of smartphones



There is a growing concern on how excessive use of smartphones can affect our children.

In addition to the effects of seeing inappropriate content online, the risk of cyberbullying and grooming, it is important that we also highlight the effects of smartphone use on our children's mental health.


If your child is using a smartphone then please try to ensure they maintain a healthy screentime limit.

According to King's College London, "two new studies of smartphone habits in teenagers have identified links between problematic smartphone use and depression, anxiety and insomnia." # **Artificial Intelligence (AI)**



#### What is AI?

Al is when a computer/machine can learn and perform tasks like a human. Its popularity continues to increase, and examples include:

- Virtual assistants like Alexa and Siri.
- Chatbots such as ChatGPT and My AI from Snapchat

#### **Potential Risks of AI?**

 Chat apps - A simple search of "AI Chat" within the App store highlights the number of apps already available and just scrolling through, you can see that they are not suitable for children with many rated as 17+.

 Image manipulation – there are AI tools that can be used to digitally remove clothes from photos, which clearly raises serious safeguarding and privacy concerns.

 Deepfakes – there are also AI tools that create realistic, fake videos which can be used to spread misinformation or cause harm.

#### How can I protect my child?

As always, to keep your child safe online, it is important to:

 Develop your child's digital literacy by highlighting the risks of AI and showing them how important it is to verify what they see online.

- Set up appropriate parental controls on their devices/ broadband.
- Chat to your child regularly and ensure your child knows that they

should talk to you or another trusted adult if anything concerns them.
